Research Question

Does the presence (or absence) of party labels in local elections impact partisan representation on city councils?

Hypothesis

In non-partisan elections, voters cannot rely on the heuristic of candidate partisanship. So, candidates that would typically affiliate with an unpopular party can run without a party and still secure victory.


Data


Nearly comprehensive data set of municipal governments and their electoral institutions in the U.S., n > 15,300. No past work has examined this question at this scale.

Partisan sample ballot

We measure officials' & residents' partisanship using a campaign consulting firm's dataset that predicts every registered voter's partisanship based on available registration, turnout, survey, geographic and consumer data.








Methods


Each resident & official is coded as either Republican/Republican Leaning or Democrat/Democrat Leaning, even if they aren't technically registered as a member of either party.

Discussion

Non-partisan elections allow for the possibility that minority party candidates "sneak" their way into office in cities where their party or ideology is unpopular.

Electoral institutions <u>matter</u> when it comes to partisan representation on U.S. city councils.

Existing literature (de Benedictis-Kessner & Warshaw 2016) establishes that the partisan leanings of local officials translates to policy outcomes, so these representational incongruities could also impact local policy.
